Re: City of Seattle's Authority to Condition Zoo Elephant Disposition

Dear Ms. Fortgang:

We have reviewed the 2001 Woodland Park Zoo Operations and Management Agreement between the city of Seattle and the Woodland Park Zoological Society (WPZS). It is our conclusion that the city is well within its legal authority to require that elephants transferred out of the Woodland Park Zoo be received by a Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries—accredited facility.

Although the agreement grants WPZS the authority to dispose of zoo animals, Section 15.3 of the agreement mandates that the disposal "be made in strict accordance with ... existing and any adopted acquisition and disposition policies approved by the City." A city ordinance, resolution, or mayoral executive order would constitute a "policy" based on the plain meaning of the term "policy." Therefore, as specifically anticipated by the agreement, the city may condition zoo elephant disposition by enacting an ordinance, resolution, or mayoral executive order to that effect.

I hope this letter will be of help to you and the elephants.
